# COMMODORE'S COMMENTS

Isla Mujeres, Mexico is a charming island with friendly residents. The Regata al Sol XXVI was the principal reason for our travel to the island, but **Anna** and I will return to visit whether there is a regatta or not. **Senior Enrique Lima** and his family were beyond gracious and helpful to the racers and racer chasers. They made sure everyone's needs were met.

The vessels from PYC did very well in this running of the Regata al Sol. Look for the details in **Fleet Captain Susan McKinnon** report in this issue of the Jib Sheet. The **Oyler's Parlay** ran a flawless course that not only won the Cruising Non-Spinnaker Division, but also won overall. Not only did *Parlay* win overall on corrected time but arrived ahead of *Decision* the winner of the Racing Division. It was the first time, in anyone's memory, that a cruising boat finished ahead of the racing boats. Congratulations to *Parlay* and crew!

Congratulations to the **Burr's Alegria** for coming in second in the Cruising Non-Spinnaker Division. Congratulations to the **Gillette's Atlantic Union** for coming in third in the Cruising Spinnaker Division. PYC did not have a vessel in the Racing Division.

Southern Yacht Club and Pensacola Yacht Club presented to **Enrique Lima** and his family the Jose de Jesus Lima Trophy. **Jose Lima** was **Enrique's** father who passed away last year at the age of 95. This trophy honors the memory, accomplishments and life of **Sr. Jose Lima**. This trophy will be awarded in future Regatta al Sol events to the yacht or sailor that best exemplifies seamanship and sportsmanship in the regatta. **Commodore Dwight LeBlanc** of SYC and I were given not only the honor of presenting this trophy, but also signing the proclamation, deed of gift for the ages in front of the **Lima** family, the Governor of Quintana Roo, Admiral of the Mexican Navy, a gaggle of local officials, the race committee, skippers, spouses, and a bushel of Mexican media. All of this took place inside **Sr. Jose Lima's** la Casa de las Rocas (the Rock House). To say the **Lima** family was deeply touched would be an understatement.

It was decided to have the inaugural award of the Jose de Jesus Lima Trophy go to Dan Valoppi, one of the crew of *Big Booty*. The Race Committee grew concerned that they were unable to raise *Carried Away* on the radio and it was the last boat still at sea. Every attempt to make contact was met with static. Dan Valoppi was now the delivery Captain sailing *Big Booty* back to its home port and volunteered to sail to the position reported by the transponder. Dan said he hoped someone would do the same for him if he had trouble. That was certainly in the spirit of the Jose de Jesus Lima Trophy. *Carried Away* did make it in because apparently they experienced complete electrical failure.

Our Gulf Coast continues to be menaced by an oil spill of ever growing magnitude. The damage to us so far has been more psychological than real. The real damage has been economic. It has hurt the tourist trade with hotel cancellations that trickles down to other businesses not to mention the loss of tax revenue before any drop of oil from this fiasco has arrived. At this point, none of PYC's planned on the water activities have been affected, but there may come a time to reassess those plans. **GYA Commodore David Bolyard**, **SYC Commodore Dwight LeBlanc** and I had a brief, but serious discussion on Isla Mujeres on the possibility of coming up with alternative plans for some of the regattas. No changes have been made as of this writing, but we will let you know if other plans are necessary.

To party or not to party, that is the question. Some members prefer partying outside while others don't. Some prefer formal parties and others don't. Some members like jazz and others like rock and roll. Some members want to party on Friday night but others want to party on Saturday night. Some like to party with their kids but others don't. Obviously, I could go on ad infinitum. We have a lot of constituencies in our Club. However when we apply the entertainment dollars to largest group possible in our Club we apparently end up not appealing to anyone based on the attendance numbers. ## VICE COMMODORE'S COMMENTS

However I have never sailed the Regatta Al Sol, the biannual 550 mile race to Isla Mujeres, Mexico. My father did the first race in 1965 and both my brothers have sailed many races to Isla, but not me---until now! As an invited crew on **Jim and Linda Oyler's** Beneteau 49, "Parlay", I have just completed my first Isla race. WOW, what an experience!

It was a race for the record book. We were first to the finish line, a rare feat for a non-spinnaker, cruising boat, first in class and first overall, in the entire fleet, on corrected time. We were looking over our shoulder at the finish line for "Decision", the scratch boat in fleet. She is a true racing, carbon fiber hot rod, a Trans Pac 52 that rates -90 under PHRF. But we never saw her as she finished more than 2 hours behind. I'm not bragging Mother Nature gave us a near perfect event with winds at 18 to 25 knots, close reach almost all the way. Maximum conditions for "Parlay" and we did have our crisis. First crew member, **Past Commodore Larry Boyer**, accidentally tripped the circuit breaker on the central air conditioning, and my gosh, for almost an hour we thought we had lost the central air conditioning. Next crisis, it started sprinkling, and for about 10 minutes, those on deck (not in the air conditioning) had to stay underneath the bimini. On a more serious note, our PYC Flag Officers and Board are keeping a close eye on the BP Horizon oil spill and its possible impact on us. We are in ongoing communication with the County, City, Navy and USCG. The situation is under constant review and appropriate updates will be made to the membership as and when necessary.

If you look east of the swimming pool, you will see that we have constructed a temporary bridge over the ditch. This will allow us better use of the sandy beach on the eastern edge of our property. With the upcoming Junior Olympic/USODA Regatta around the Fourth of July weekend and the August US Sailing Singlehanded Championship, having the access to our beachfront is essential. Thanks to **Neil McMillan, Andrew McMillan, Stuart McMillan, George Gamble** and staff members, **Greg and Jason**, for making this needed improvement a reality.

### Junior Sailing News & Sailing Results

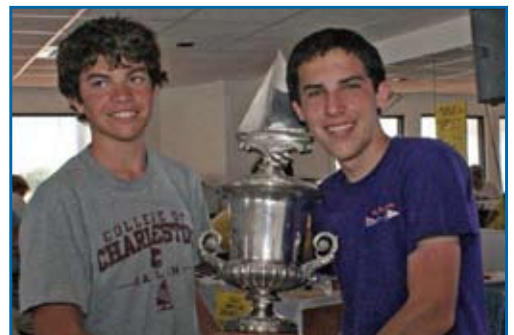

For the past five or so years, PYC members have had the opportunity to attend a wide variety of Wednesday evening yachting seminars. The latest seminar held last month on Wednesday evening May 5th was especially helpful for any Club cruiser/sailors who are hoping to overcome the daunting challenge of a Gulf crossing.

PYC members, Bob and Vickie Riggs along with Helen and John Caffery have made literally dozens of crossings between them and they've made their trips seem nearly effortless. Of course, as Bob Riggs pointed out as he opened his discussion of the "Bon Vivants Cruising Guide To Western Florida" seminar, making the crossing can at times "be intimidating" and, without question, the "most important part" of the trip, he said, is the time spent in preparation.

That means making sure your boat is mechanically sound. All safety gear has been checked and re-checked. Ship's papers and registration are all up to date and in a safe and waterproof place and posted as required by law. And, then as Bob and Vickie both pointed out they then begin playing the game of "what if". What if this or that goes wrong... what's our back-up... our plan "B"?

The Rigg's are power boaters and have crossed the Gulf many times in their 44' Ocean Alexander. But, the Caffrey's are sailors and they have special considerations to consider. Such as what their Catalina 35' mast height is and which bridges they can clear and which ones they cannot. Another way of looking at that is this... when must they sail offshore and when can they transit the ICW?

But, once across the Gulf, the real fun begins. The Rigg's and Caffrey's know all the ins and outs of sailing Florida waters from Clearwater southward to the Keys. They gave all those attending some really great information about which FCYC member clubs are most desirable and should not be missed. # FCYC REPORT

Greetings from your Florida Council of Yacht Clubs Director and best wishes as we kick off a new **Jib Sheet** column that will hopefully keep you apprised of recent and on-going activities of the Council.

Most recent activities center around the May 14-16 FCYC meeting held two weeks ago at the Marathon Yacht Club. The Directors' Meeting was held Saturday afternoon May 15, at which 32 of the 36 member clubs were present.

FCYC Commodore Don Stanley from the Tampa Yacht Club has stepped into his new role without missing a beat from last year's administration. High on the list of topics covered at the gathering was the subject of reciprocity, which is an important aspect of FCYC membership by the 36 council clubs around the state.

PYC cruisers who have traveled on their boats around the state of Florida know and understand the advantage of being a member of FCYC when it comes time to dock for the evening and spend a day or two at one of the other member clubs. Basically, you become a member of that club (on a very temporary basis) and enjoy all that a club has to offer.

But, reciprocity is not just for boaters. PYC members who visit member club locations by car or RV for instance can take advantage of those club facilities as well. That means great tennis and dining plus other activities. And, remember... no cash or credit cards. Your bill is sent back to PYC for payment as part of your regular monthly processing. Not bad, eh?

At the Marathon meeting there were several questions about reciprocity and Commodore Stanley promises there will be answers at upcoming meetings. Primary questions concern how member clubs deal with boaters who are not members of FCYC clubs. Can they enjoy the same privileges we do? The short answer is – NO.

Following the Directors' Meeting there were Committee Reports, Coast Guard and Fleet Captains' Meetings, then the Governmental Affairs Meeting followed by the General Meeting with comments from the floor. It was a busy afternoon with excellent attendance from FCYC member clubs throughout the state.

One suggestion at the Coast Guard meeting is that PYC members with boats have them inspected by the Coast Guard Auxiliary. Reason? Most boaters, who display the C.G. inspected sticker on their boats, will NOT get boarded by the Coast Guard when a C.G. boat pulls up alongside to have a looksee.

HAM radio is going to be a big deal at the St. Petersburg Yacht Club in the future. They are organizing a HAM radio station at their club and want to organize a weekly "schedule" with other member clubs.

In tough economic times the question of economic health is always on the minds of members. Fortunately the FCYC Executive Board watches its budget numbers closely and the economic health of the organization is in good condition with no outstanding liabilities that could significantly alter that condition.

### Recent Items From FCYC This Spring

The Coast Guard has suggested all recreational boats be required to install and use a Class B AIS transponder for tracking and location purposes. Boat US has testified in opposition to this proposal before the Coast Guard and Maritime Transportation Committee of the House. FCYC supports their position.

The Coast Guard has decommissioned the Loran C navigation sites.

NOAA has proposed an amendment to the regulations for the Florida Marine Sanctuary that would require that sanitation devices on boats operating within the sanctuary be locked to prevent discharge. FCYC is monitoring developments.

### At the Florida State Level

Effective 1/1/10 boat operators with 10 hp and over born after 1/1/88 must pass an approved boating safety course.

### Special Invitation To FCYC Member Clubs

In April of this year a special invitation was made to FCYC member clubs for their membership to take advantage of special rates for any boaters who would like to stop at the Key Largo Anglers Club between now and October of this year.

If any PYC members are interested in the particulars of this offer – please contact PYC/FCYC Director Don Watson.

### FCYC History

FCYC was formed in 1960 following an invitation from the St. Petersburg Yacht Club to leading West Coast Yacht Clubs to form an organization to encourage the sport of yachting. The following year, articles of incorporation were filed with the Florida Secretary of State. PYC joined the FCYC in September 1988.
